Re: Game Fish Culture, Trout Distributions;

1. On Thursday March 5th. 1942, Game Warden Jones of Victoria arrived in Duncan at about 11 am. with 5000 Kamloops Trout, these trout were planted in Quamichan Lake with no fish lost.
2. At 3pm. on the same date Game Warden Jones arrived at Rogers Lake with 5000 Trout these fish were planted with no loss of fish.
3. On Friday Mar. 6th. G.W. Jones arrived in Duncan with 5000 more fish for Quamichan Lake, these were planted only four dead fish seen.
Making a total of 10,000 fish planted in Quamichan Lake.
4. I have visited the seen of the plantings since and there are no dead fish to be seen.
