## PUBLIC NOTICE Amendment to Business Licence Bylaw

NOTICE IS GIVEN that Council for the District of North Cowichan will be considering amendments to Business Licence Bylaw No. 3153, 2002, as amended, through the adoption of Business Licence Amendment Bylaw No. 3962 at their Public Hearing meeting being held on Wednesday, August 21, 2024, at 5:00 p.m. The amendment, in general, proposes to remove section 8 which deals with reconsideration to avoid any conflict with section 7 in Delegation of Authority Bylaw No. 3814, 2021, which includes similar provisions.

Anyone who considers themselves to be affected by the bylaw will be provided an opportunity to make representation to Council during the meeting, or they may submit their written comments by:
